KEY REMINDERS- ARRIVAL TO SCHOOL SECONDARY & SIXTH FORM

We are half way through Term 4 and we have noticed more and more students arriving late to school. As exams are just around the corner all students must come to school on time. Please see below for more guidance on making sure students arrive on time:

- The school gate will open at 8.10 am and will close at 8.20 am.
- Students register with their Form Tutor at 8.25 am; all students must be present for registration. If your son/daughter arrives after 8.25 am, he/she is recorded as late and must sign in at the Secondary and Sixth Form School Office or designated location.
- Students who are persistently late for morning registration will receive a sanction. Consistent lateness and poor attendance will be followed up by the Tutor, Head of Year or Attendance Officer, according to our Student Attendance Policy. All students are required to be in Tutor Period at 8.25 am.
- If students plan on being late due to exceptional circumstances they must fill out a Withdrawal from Learning Form. Available here. This must be done a minimum of fourteen days in advance of the lateness.


Year 4 Trip to the Library




